# CORTLAND COUNTY 9/11 CEREMONY

The 9/11 memorial was installed and unveiled last year in Court House Park. This years ceremony will take place on September 11, 2019 at 8:30AM. Cortland City Police Chaplain Pastor Matthew Smith will be speaking along with retired Colonel Kevin Forney. Colonel Forney was a task force commander for over 800 soldiers deployed immediately after the attack on NYC. Colonel Forney was also in charge of providing security to nine airports and three power plants on top of all other key areas in the city. This year, we will be recognizing four individuals who lost their lives in the 9/11 attacks or post 9/11 from carcinogens inhaled during rescue efforts. Each of these individuals have ties to the Cortland community, all of which have had bricks installed last year prior to the first ceremony.



## FALL ATHLETICS

### TRAVEL REC SOCCER LEAGUE

This is an instructional program for boys and girls in 1st through 6th grade. Participants will learn soccer fundamentals, lead up skills, drills and play games. Players will be put into teams based on grade level. **Cost:** \$30 for city residents, \$40 for non city residents. **Games will be held on Saturday mornings in Cortland, Tully, DeRuyter, Fabius, and Lafayette starting September 14 through October 19.** Coaches will contact players about practice schedules. Practices will be held at Beaudry Park. All players must have shin guards.

### YOUTH FOOTBALL & CHEERLEADING

Football season is upon us. Our youth football and cheerleading programs will participate in the Route 81 travel league this fall. The football league has a flag division (grades K, 1, & 2), junior tackle division (grades 3 & 4), and senior tackle division (grades 5 & 6). There will be a pre-season scrimmage the week of September 7th and games start the weekend of September 14th with games being held on Saturday mornings. This league plays games against Homer, Groton, the Apple Valley Timberwolves, and crossover games with Southern Tier and FLYFCL League Teams. Cheerleading has a junior division (grades 3 & 4) and senior division (grades 5 and 6), where participants will learn basic cheerleading fundamentals including skills, cheers, and dance routines.

### SHIN GUARD & CLEAT SWAMP

Do you have shin guards or cleats (soccer, football, or baseball) that you don't need or don't fit anymore? Bring them to the CYB office and you can swap them out for the ones that fit or leave them for someone who needs them.



# YOUTH SPORTS & PROGRAMS

## JOHN TOBIN YOUTH BASKETBALL LEAGUE

The CYB Youth Basketball program format will change during the 2019-2020 season. Our program will have an instructional component and multiple divisions for league games. The new program will be offered to boys and girls in grades 1st - 6th. Grades 1st and 2nd will have an instructional clinic, grades 3rd through 6th will include instructional skills and league games. Competition of league play will include games against surrounding communities.

Registration for the basketball program is on RecDesk and will be held from September 16th through October 25th. The program fee is \$50 and will include a t-shirt or uniform. Practice sessions will begin in early November and games will start in January 2020. Practices will be held at local elementary schools and games will be played at the Cortland YMCA, YWCA, County Gym, and Cortland High School. The league is seeking knowledgeable basketball coaches and officials. Applications and background check forms are available at the CYB office.

## GREEK PEAK SKI & SNOWBOARD CLUB

Skiers and snowboarders come join the Cortland Youth Bureau's after school ski club and enjoy Central New York's largest ski center. Greek Peak offers over 40 trails and 6 lifts for your skiing enjoyment. Program fliers and registration information will be available at the CYB office and the Cortland elementary schools in September. Skiers must provide a photo for ski pass. A ski bus will pick students up at Cortland elementary schools and return to Barry elementary. The six-week ski bus will be for students who purchased the after school package. Students with season passes will only be accommodated if seats on the bus exist after December 6. Online registration opens September 1 at [sales.greekpeak.net](http://sales.greekpeak.net). Transportation registration must be completed at [cortlandyb.recdesk.com](http://cortlandyb.recdesk.com). **Grade:** 4th, 5th, or 6th. **Times:** Wednesday's 4:00-6:30pm. ## WRESTLING

Join the Cortland Youth Bureau wrestling program to learn basic techniques and fundamentals of wrestling. Practice sessions will be held on weekday evenings at the Cortland High School wrestling room. Our wrestling program is for youth in grades 1-6. Matches with other local wrestling clubs will be scheduled, and wrestlers can participate in the end of the year league tournament. **Cost:** \$35 city residents and \$45 non city residents. **Practices** will begin early January through mid March, dates are TBA. **Registration** starts on-line November 1st through December 31st.



## FUN FOR TOTS

Give your child, between the ages of 1 and 5, the opportunity to interact with other children his or her age. Children under one year of age are welcome to come with their siblings at no charge. This is also a great opportunity for you to get to know other parents in the community. The group meets Mondays and Wednesdays from 10-11:30am and often meets at the County Office Building Gym to play with a wide variety of toys that are supplied by the CYB. The group also goes on field trips to different places in the community. The program begins on Monday, September 23 and will come to a close on Wednesday, June 3, 2020. **Cost:** \$30 per child for city residents, \$40 per child for non city residents. Registration will be ongoing throughout the program and will begin on-line on August 1.

### EASTER EGG HUNT

The CYB and the Easter Bunny will host this year's Egg Hunt at Suggett Park on Saturday, April 4, 2020 at 10:00am. There will be a rain date of Sunday, April 5 at 2:00pm. Any youth 10 and under are welcome to join the hunt! Suggett Park will be split into sections for children in four different age groups. Over 4,000 eggs will be filled with candy and prize tickets. There will also be a grand prize egg in each section to be redeemed for a new scooter or bike! Hunters should bring their own baskets to collect eggs in. Visit the Easter Bunny, have your face painted, and enjoy the pony rides and entertainment.

### 56th ANNUAL 6th, 7th, & 8th GRADE SPELLING BEE

The Cortland Youth Bureau will sponsor the 56th Annual Spelling Bee for Cortland County's 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students. The written phase of the Spelling Bee will be conducted on Wednesday, January 22 at 3:30pm at the Cortland High School LGI Room. The top sixteen students from the written phase of the spelling bee will become the semi-finalists in the oral phase of the spelling bee held on February 5. Each semi-finalist will receive a Webster's dictionary with their name imprinted as a remembrance of their spelling for the 2019 Cortland County Spelling Bee. The final round will be held on February 26. All 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students residing in Cortland County are eligible to take part in the Spelling Bee. The winner of the spelling bee will receive a laptop computer or an \$800 college savings fund. Parents should encourage their students to participate.



### HS BOYS LACROSSE CLINIC

Cortland State Cradle of Coaches Legends will conduct a High School Clinic for boys in grades 7-12. University of Denver head coach Bill Tierney and players will lead the clinic. Clinic will be held on Saturday, October 5 from 11:00am until 1:00pm. Players interested in participating must register online at [cortlandyb.recdesk.com](http://cortlandyb.recdesk.com). The fee is \$35.



### US LACROSSE TRYLAX CLINIC

US Lacrosse and the CYB have teamed up to sponsor a TryLax clinic for boys and girls ages 6-13 years old. TryLax is a 90 minute, introductory lacrosse experience for kids who have never played before, but are thinking they might want to. The clinic will be conducted by US Lacrosse trained coaches from the local community, in an effort to connect you with a program in your area.

## YOUTH SERVICES

The Youth Services division of the Cortland Youth Bureau promotes positive youth development by providing recreational, cultural, and educational opportunities for teens and pre-teens. Staff members also offer informal counseling and referrals to other service agencies in the community. Overall, the multi-faceted program encourages kids to engage in productive behaviors, establish healthy beliefs, and maintain clear standards for themselves and their peers. This holistic approach to youth development helps our young people build the assets they need to carry them into adulthood.

## YOUTH CENTER OPPORTUNITIES

Our staff work hard to ensure that we offer something for everyone at the Youth Center. Many of the ideas for our programs come from teens and their parents. If you have an idea of a program or event that you would like to see offered in Cortland please share it with us. We strive to offer relevant and exciting programming for all youth in our community.

## AGE REQUIREMENTS

The Center welcomes 11-12 year olds or those in 5th and 6th grades to attend from 3-6pm on weeknights. Those 13-18 or in 7th-12th grades are welcome to attend the Center during all open hours.

## CYB YOUTH CENTER

Located in downtown Cortland at 35 Port Watson Street, the Youth Center offers a huge variety of programs and events for young people: Field trips, game tournaments, tutoring, guest speakers, music lessons, artwork, craft projects, cooking classes, free dinners, job-search assistance, volunteer opportunities, and more. The facility itself is equipped with pool, ping-pong, and foosball tables; a full kitchen; a music room with guitars, amps, and a full drum-kit; a sound stage and DJ booth; and closets full of board games and craft supplies. There are always responsible, caring staff members on the premises to play games with you, help with your homework, or connect you with other service agencies if you need them. ## HERE FOR EVERYONE

All of the Youth Services programs and activities can accommodate people with special needs. Staff members are prepared to offer extra assistance if needed. On field trips, every effort will be made to include all youths in activities, and open spots can be added to accommodate a trained professional assistant or caseworker. Parents should feel free to discuss their child's needs with Youth Center staff members.



### CALENDAR & NEWSLETTER

The Youth Center's monthly activity calendar is always posted at the Center, but you can also have it mailed directly to your house. The calendar is printed and mailed around the first of every month and it lists all of the Center's upcoming field trips, tournaments, concerts, fundraisers, etc. It also features information about special events, interesting people, and other community agencies that offer services for youth. Give the Center a call to get your name on the mailing list. The calendar is also posted on our website.



### VOLUNTEER INCENTIVE PROGRAM

Kids who do community service or help with events at the Youth Center can turn their time into money not cash, but discounts on the Centers field trip and program fees. For every hour a youth spends volunteering, the Center will take \$4.00 off the price of a field trip or program. Kids can use their service credits immediately or save them up for later use. Credits earned and used are recorded in a logbook. For those interested in earning credits around town, a handy guide is available which lists the contact information for local agencies and businesses in need of volunteers.

### OUR KITCHEN

If you like to cook (or if you just like to eat), then stop by the Youth Center on weeknights around supper time. Two or three times a week, we cook up a full dinner for all to enjoy. The meals are always free. Kids are welcome to help with cooking under the supervision of staff. We also offer a monthly Family Dinner Night, when parents, grandparents, and siblings can come to dinner as well. The monthly Dinner Calendar is always posted online along with the activity calendar.

### YOUTH INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

The Youth Center offers a paid 4-month internship program to kids 14 and older. The position involves in-house programming, event coordination, clerical tasks, and general assistance with daily operational chores. Everyone who applies will be interviewed (applicants 17 and under must have their working papers). The next internship session will begin in January, 2020. Applications will be available at the Center early in December.

### THANKSGIVING DINNER

Every November, the Youth Center staff cooks a traditional Thanksgiving dinner for our kids and their families. The menu includes all your Thanksgiving favorites: Roast turkey, ham, mashed potatoes, hot rolls, fresh-baked pies, and more. There is no cost and all family members are welcome. This year, the Thanksgiving Dinner will be on Thursday, November 14th, at 5pm.



### DECEMBER HOLIDAY PARTY

Join us for the annual Youth Center Holiday Party as we remember a fun-filled year complete with friends and special memories. This Youth Center tradition will take place Thursday, December 19th at 5pm. The evening will be filled with great food and plenty of holiday cheer. Check out the December calendar for more details.

### SYRACUSE CRUNCH & BINGHAMTON DEVILS GAMES

### SATURDAY BAND NIGHTS

There's nothing like live music, and its here at the Youth Center once a month. Our performers include metal and punk bands, classic rock cover bands, solo acoustic artists, and everything in between. Doors open at 7:00pm; admission at only \$3.00. Band nights are open to teens only; a parent or legal guardian must accompany anyone under 13. During the show, all the usual Youth Center fun – pool and foosball is still available. Dates of the scheduled band nights will be posted in our monthly calendar.

### OPEN MIC NIGHT

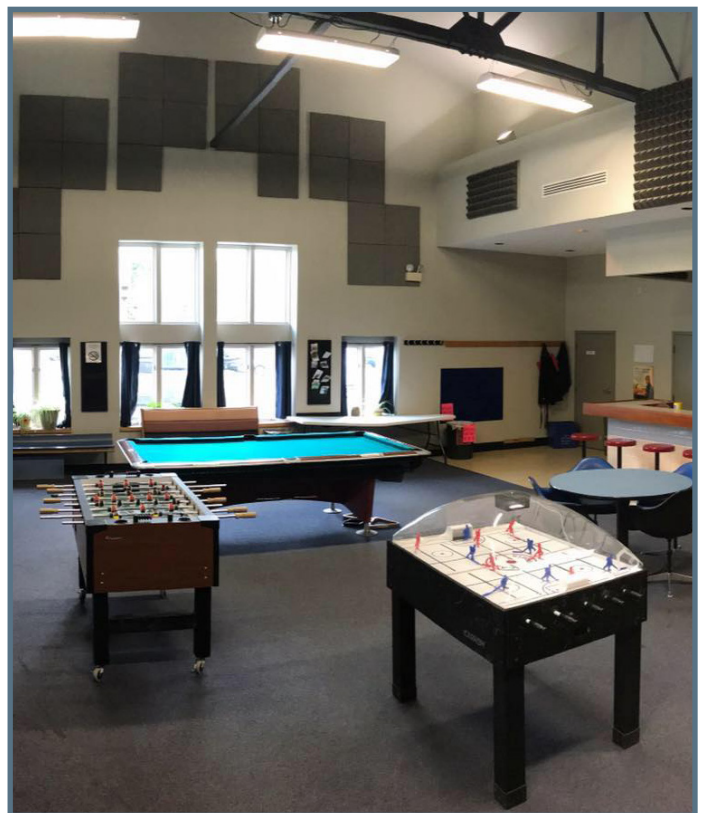

## UPCOMING PROGRAMS AT THE YWCA CORTLAND

Gymnastic classes range from parent and tot classes for ages 1-2 to preschool gymnastics for ages 2-5, and beginner gymnastics for ages 5-12. Registration will run up until September 10.
