Facility Reservations

Reservations must be completed for picnic facilities, buildings, and athletic fields by completing the on-line reservation form. For your outdoor event, consider one of the Youth Bureau's picnic facilities:

YAMAN, SUGGETT, & BEAUDRY PARK FACILITIES:

- Can accommodate 100-150 people
- Equipped with tables, grills, chairs, and rest rooms
- Price: \$150 for city residents, \$175 for non-city residents
- *A security deposit of \$100 is required for all rentals

DEXTER PARK, BEAUDRY PARK, YAMAN PARK CABANAS:

• Smaller shelters. First come, first serve basis

Gymnasium Reservations

Located off Greenbush Street, this facility is available for recreational use, mainly basketball and volleyball. Reservations must be made on the City Youth Bureau website by a responsible individual at least 21 years of age. Cost: \$40 for a two hour time slot. A \$100 deposit is required for the key.

Late Fee Policy

Any registration after the start of the program will incur a \$10 late fee charge.

Refund Policy

Any refund requested before the program begins will be granted a full refund, minus a \$5 processing fee.

Any refund requested after the program begins will be granted half the program fee, minus a \$5 processing fee.

Security Deposit

A security deposit of \$100, cash or check only, is required for all facility key sign-outs. The only exception will be granted by the Director or Assistant Director and written on the key sign out form.

Facility Rentals

You may not enter the building (for set up, bringing items over, etc) until the day of your reservation.

POOL MEMBERSHIP INFO

Patrons can register for their free Wickwire Pool membership at cortlandyb.recdesk.com > Pool Memberships. All patrons 11 and older will be required to show an ID card upon entrance to the pool. Youth 10 and younger must have an adult 18 or older with a valid pool ID with them. Pool members must reside in Cortland County. Guest passes are available for those visiting, a member must be present at the pool with their guests. Missing ID cards should be reported to a lifeguard or Youth Bureau staff as soon as possible.



EARLY BIRD SWIM Early risers can participate in our 6:00AM to 8:00AM session Monday through Saturday. The fee to participate is \$40 for a season pass. All participants must register online starting May 1, lap swim and exercise only.



SWIM LESSONS Free swim lessons for youth age 7-17 will be offered at Wickwire Pool from July 7 thourgh July 25 between 9:00am and 11:30am. Registration will begin June 1 online, and will run until June 30 or until 75 youth are registered.

WATER BABIES This program is intended to allow newborns and children 3 and under the opportunity to become comfortable in the water and swim with parents without the worry of splashes from other patrons. Water Babies will meet on Sunday's 11am-noon at Wickwire Pool. \$30 per child. An adult must be in the water at all times with the child. Registration begins May 1 at **cortlandyb.recdesk.com**.

Weather policy All aquatics facilities will close immediately for thunder and lighting. They will remain closed for 30 minutes after the last sight of lightning or sounds of thunder. The facilities will also close in the event of heavy rain which impedes the lifeguards sight.

SUMMER PARK BUILDINGS Playground buildings at Beaudry and Suggett will be open Monday through Friday, 9am to 5pm, starting June 23 until August 15. Each building will offer recreational programs, table games, arts & crafts, and athletics. Buildings are supervised by park leaders who prepare daily activities. Participation is free and participants are free to come and go as they please throughout the day. Children under 8 years old must be with an adult.

ART CAMP Miss Molly is back for another year of art camp at the Rotary Shelter and she's cooking up tons of art projects for the 8th year! Canvas paintings, drawing bootcamp, fabric dying, mystical creatures, portraits, and much more! ULA SUMMER LEAGUE The upstate lacrosse association is one of the largest youth lacrosse leagues in the United States. The league provides an excellent opportunity for its youth to learn and develop their skills, play organized competitive games and have fun playing lacrosse with their peers. There will be a six week registration from February 1st to May 19th on our website. The Home-Cort Youth Lacrosse Association will be fielding teams for boys and girls in each of the following grade divisions: 3rd and 4th, 5th and 6th, & 7th and 8th. Preseason practices begin in early May.

LITTLE STICKS LACROSSE HCYLA will sponsor a youth lacrosse program targeting boys and girls in 1st and 2nd grades from July 7th through July 25th. The instructional program will introduce players to the basic fundamentals of the game. There will be a major emphasis on having fun and playing lacrosse with their peers. Players must provide their own sticks and mouth pieces. Register on our website June 1st.



cathy stage softball program is part of the Cathy Stage and Cortland County softball leagues. All teams that play in the Cathy Stage league abides by the leagues local rules and play against local townships. These leagues provide an opportunity for participants to learn the basic fundamentals, play organized games and to have fun playing softball. The CYB will field teams for 10U and 12U divisions. Play begins in early May for the Cathy Stage League and ends in late June. 10U will practice and play games on Tuesdays and Thursdays. 12U will practice and play games on Mondays and Wednesdays. Registration begins February 3rd.





CCYSA SUMMER SOCCER The Cortland County Youth Soccer Association, in partnership with the CYB, is offering an instructional and recreational league to introduce and develop soccer skills. Designed for ages 5-12, sign ups begin in early May and close early June. Teams will be formed and league play will begin mid-July. Separate boys and girls divisions are available.

CORTLAND YOUTH CHEER AND FOOTBALL Our 2025 youth football and cheerleading programs will participate in the Route 81 travel league. The travel football league has divisions for flag (grades K-2), junior (grades), and senior (grades 5-6) and requires registration to be held on our website starting June 1st. Cheerleading has divisions for junior (grades 3-4) and senior (grades 5-6). Practice sessions will begin in mid-August at Suggett Park. Games will be held weekends in September and October at various sites in CNY.

CROWN CITY LITTLE LEAGUE CCLL's opening day for the 2025 season is scheduled for April 28th. Paid umpiring opportunities for young adults ages 13 and over are available. Be sure to join us for our annual SUNDAY FUNDAY – date TBA that includes a hit–a-thon, coach dunking booth, door prizes and different bounce houses. Money raised helps offset the cost of player clinics, uniforms, new team equipment and other league operating costs.

EASTER EGG HUNT The CYB and the Easter bunny will host this years egg hunt at Suggett Park on Saturday April 12th beginning at 10am SHARP. Any youth up to and including 10 are welcome to join the hunt. Suggett Park will be split into sections for children of different age groups. Rec Center


CORTLAND REC CENTER Located in downtown Cortland at 35 Port Watson Street, the Rec Center offers a huge variety of programs and events for young people: Field trips, game tournaments, tutoring, guest speakers, music lessons, artwork, craft projects, cooking classes, free dinners, job-search assistance, volunteer opportunities, and more. The facility itself is equipped with pool, ping-pong, air hockey, and foosball tables; a full kitchen; a music room with guitars, amps, and a full drum-kit; a sound stage and DJ booth; and closets full of board games and craft supplies. There are always responsible, caring staff members on the premises to play games with you, help with your homework, or connect you with other service agencies if you need them. AGE REQUIREMENTS The Center welcomes 11-12 year old or those in 5th and 6th grades to attend from 3-6pm on weeknights. Those 13-18 or in 7th-12th grades are welcome to attend the Center during all open hours.

WE ARE HERE FOR EVERYONE All of the Youth Services programs and activities can accommodate people with special needs. Staff members are prepared to offer extra assistance if needed. On field trips, every effort will be made to include all youths in activities, and open spots can be added to accommodate a trained professional assistant or caseworker. Parents should feel free to discuss their child's needs with Youth Center staff members.

VOLUNTEER INCENTIVE PROGRAM Kids who do community service or help with tasks at the Rec Center can earn discounts on the Center's field trip and program fees. For every hour a youth spends volunteering, the Center will take \$5.00 off the price of a field trip or program. Kids can use their service credits immediately or save them up for later use. Credits earned and used are recorded in a logbook. Rec Center staff can help place teens with businesses and agencies who need volunteers.

KITCHEN PROGRAM If you like to cook (or if you just like to eat), then stop by the Rec Center on weeknights around suppertime. Two or three nights per week, we cook up a full dinner for all to enjoy. The meals are always free. Kids are welcome to help with the cooking under the supervision of staff. We also offer periodic cooking classes and theme nights, so keep your eye on the calendar. The Youth Center kitchen operates under strict Health Department guidelines and is regularly cleaned and inspected.
